Delivery of Exhibits: Thursday, Sept. 7th – between 10 am and 5:30 pm. Bring exhibits to Mellor Hall; they must be in place by 6 pm for judging.

Pick Up of Exhibits: Sunday, Sept. 10th – after 4 pm.

All Fruit items must be picked up on the Sunday.

Prize Money: 1st - \$5, 2nd - \$3, 3rd - ribbon only.

Pick up prize money and special awards from the Exhibition Office during the week of Sept. 25th to 29th – 9 am to 5 pm.

Rules:

- All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor and must be free from insect damage and disease injury.

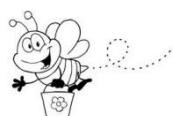

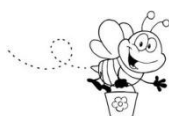

- Only 1 entry per exhibitor per class with the exception of the A.O.V. (Any Other Variety) classes. In those classes an exhibitor may have more than one entry, **provided each entry is of a different variety**. Please identify if known.
- If there are three or more exhibits of the same variety in an A.O.V. class, a separate class will be made for that variety with prize money to be the same as the class in which they had been entered.
- Naming the variety of the entry in the individual classes is an option; please identify it if known and print the name at the top of the Exhibit Tag or on a piece of paper.
- Note that classes are listed for red or standard strains of various apples. The unlisted type should be entered in the appropriate A.O.V. class and named.
- Quantity must be as called for in each class.
- Exhibitor’s Pass:** exhibitors may purchase a 3-day pass for \$15. The regular gate fee for adults is \$10 per day.
