Entry Fee: \$1 per entry

Register between July 16th and Aug. 31st. Last day to register: Friday, August 31st, by 5 pm.

Delivery of Exhibits: Please bring all Fruit exhibits to Mellor Hall on **Thursday, Sept. 6th** between 10 am and 5:30 pm.

They must be in place by 6 pm for judging.

Pick Up of Exhibits: Sunday, Sept. 9th – after 4 pm.

All Fruit items must be picked up on the Sunday.

Prize Money: 1st - \$5, 2nd - \$3, 3rd - ribbon only.

Pick up prize money and special awards from the Exhibition Office during the week of Sept. 24th to 28th – 9 am to 5 pm.

Rules:

- a. All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor and must be free from insect damage and disease injury.

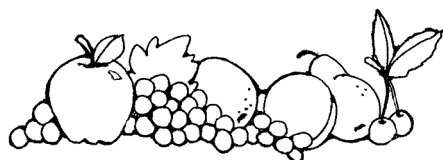

- b. Only 1 entry per exhibitor per class with the exception of the A.O.V. (Any Other Variety) classes. In those classes an exhibitor may have more than one entry, **provided each entry is of a different variety**. Please identify if known.
- c. If there are three or more exhibits of the same variety in an A.O.V. class, a separate class will be made for that variety with prize money to be the same as the class in which they had been entered.
- d. Naming the variety of the entry in the individual classes is an option; please identify it if known and print the name at the top of the Exhibit Tag or on a piece of paper.
- e. The Cowichan Exhibition will be using the BC Council of Garden Clubs’ Horticulture Judging and Exhibiting Standards (2017) as its reference.
- f. Quantity must be as called for in each class.
- g. **Exhibitor’s Pass:** exhibitors may purchase a 3-day pass for \$17. The regular gate fee for adults is \$10-\$12/day.
