



**REGISTRATION:** Opens Wed., Aug. 4 and closes on Wed., Sept. 8. Register online at www.cowex.ca, click on FAIR 2021 and follow the links. Or register in person in the Office, from 9:30 to 4:00 on any week day.

**AGE GROUPS:** On the entry form, indicate your age group: Open, Junior 12 & under, or Junior 13 to 17.

**ENTRY FEES:** Just as we did for last year's UN.Fair-20, the Cowichan Exhibition will not charge exhibitors a \$1 fee/entry to enter their garden produce, cannabis, baking, arts and crafts, photography and needlework projects into the Fair. It's another unusual year and your support is much appreciated; without your participation, the tables in Mellor Hall and walls in the Barn would be empty!

**JUDGING, PRIZE MONEY & SPECIALS:** All classes will be judged and there will be ribbons for the winning entries. In the Open categories, there are a number of special prizes donated by businesses and individuals but this year no regular prize money. To encourage our younger exhibitors, there will be 1st, 2nd and 3rd place prize money in the Juniors category (L). Some of those dollars plus more specials have been supplied by several of our advertisers. Our thanks to everyone for playing such an important role in the 2021 Exhibition!





### Bricks of Butter helped build Cowichan's Economy

The images that spring to mind with this year's theme, "Follow the Yellow Brick Road", are both the yellow-hued clay bricks manufactured in Somenos, and the more edible kind: bricks of butter!

Before the Cowichan Creamery Co-operative was established in 1895, farming families produced butter themselves, which they shaped into bricks, wrapped in wax paper and delivered to retailers. The inconsistent quality of the butter distributed by farmers, however, resulted in some unsatisfied consumers. The Creamery standardized its manufacture, as it was overseen by butter-making experts. The distribution of butter was also vastly improved with the construction of the railway, opening markets in Victoria and Nanaimo.

While the Creamery revolutionized the production of butter in the valley, it had some less obvious effects on family financial dynamics. Previously, making butter for market was considered a cottage industry, and the arduous task of churning butter fell to farm women. These women were able to carve out a little financial independence from their earnings. However, this modest revenue stream was lost when production was given over to the Creamery, and earnings went directly to their husbands' incomes.

The other notable local yellow brick was manufactured from 1908 to 1932 by Jennings & Son and by an unnamed Chinese brickyard in Somenos. The BC Geological Survey described the Duncan clay deposits as "somewhat sandy and yellowish to bluish gray in colour and in most places contain fairly abundant pebbles." The collection of the Cowichan Valley Museum & Archives has many artifacts from our built environment, including Somenos bricks.

The Cowichan Exhibition is an annual celebration of values associated with farming life and our agricultural heritage, including traditional Indigenous stewardship of the land. In the song "Goodbye Yellow Brick Road," Elton John advocates for connection to the land over the pursuit of urban wealth with the lyrics, "You can't plant me in your penthouse, I'm going back to my plough."


