



THEME, HOURS, ADMISSION AND PASSES

- a. 2022 Theme: "Jack & the Beanstalk"
- b. 2022 Colours: Green, Gold & Pantone's Very Peri
- c. 2022 Exhibition: Friday, Sept. 16; Saturday, Sept. 17, and Sunday, Sept. 18. The Midway is open Thursday, Sept. 15.
- d. The Grounds will be open to the public 8 am 10 pm on Friday and Saturday, and 8 am 4 pm on Sunday.
- e. Mellor Hall will be open to the public 9 am 8 pm on Friday and Saturday, and 9:30 am 4 pm on Sunday.
- f. The Barns will be open to the public 9 am 8 pm on Friday and Saturday, and 9:30 am 4 pm on Sunday
- g. Daily Admission (in effect until 3:30 pm on Sunday):
 Adult \$12 Friday & Saturday, \$10 Sunday
 Senior (65 & older) & Student \$9
 Child (7 to 13) \$6
 6 and under free
- h. 3-day passes \$25. Purchase prior to Sept. 15, 2022.
- i. 4-H members Exhibition bracelets are required.

PARKING AND UNLOADING

- a. All persons entering the Grounds must pay admission.
- b. All vehicles entering the Grounds during the Exhibition must display a Vehicle Pass, available at the Office.
- c. Only feed /livestock trucks and other service vehicles will be allowed on the Grounds prior to 10 am daily.
- d. No vehicle access to the Grounds between 10 am 4 pm.
- e. Parking is available in designated areas outside Gate #3 (Buckerfield's Gate).
- f. Security is on site 24 hours from Thursday Sunday.

COMMERCIAL EXHIBITS AND CONCESSIONAIRES

- Food Concessions and Outside Commercial Displays must be in place by 9 pm, Thursday, Sept. 15, 2022. Indoor Commercial Booths must be in place prior to 6 pm.
- b. Space renters are fully responsible for their displays during the Exhibition's open hours.

LIABILITIES AND OBLIGATIONS

- a. Any exhibitor who violates any general or specific Division Rule shall forfeit any or all prize money and any awards made to them.
- b. Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion, and other exhibits liable to cause accidents, injury or damage to property or persons coming in contact with them, shall guard their exhibits and protect the public from coming in contact with them.
- c. Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Cowichan Exhibition from and against all claims, demands, costs, charges and expenses which it may incur, suffer, or by reason of any accident or of any person being injured or suffering damage through or by reason of any such exhibit,

- performance or concession not properly guarded or the public not be protected from it. While the Board will take all reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of the entries sent to the Cowichan Exhibition, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting them. Should any entry be accidentally injured, lost or stolen, the Board will give all assistance in their power towards its recovery, but will not make any payment for it.
- d. No claim for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted or suit be maintained against the Cowichan Exhibition, its Directors or their agents, by or on behalf of any visitor, exhibitor, or any person, firm or corporation, or their agents, representatives, servants or employees, having license of privileges to visit or exhibit at the Cowichan Exhibition or occupying any space thereon.
- e. Any article or stand left in the buildings or on the Grounds after the close of the Exhibition will be at the risk of the owner. The Cowichan Exhibition's Board will recognize no accounts unless incurred by order of the Board.

JUDGING AND DISPUTES

- a. The Judge's decision(s) will be final.
- b. All Livestock class protests must be made in writing, must state plainly the nature of the complaint, and must be delivered with a deposit of \$25 to the Exhibition Office within 3 hours of the judge's decision.
- c. All Hall class protests must be made in writing, must state plainly the nature of complaint, and must be delivered with a deposit of \$25 to the Exhibition Office by 6 pm, Friday, Sept. 16, 2022.
- d. In both cases, the deposit will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. The Exhibition's Board of Directors shall be the final judge of all protests.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- a. 2022 Theme: "Jack & the Beanstalk"
- b. 2022 Colours: Green, Gold & Pantone's Very Peri
- c. 2022 Exhibition: Friday, Sept. 16; Saturday, Sept. 17, and Sunday, Sept. 18. The Midway is open Thursday, Sept. 15.
- d. All entries must be made out on the appropriate Exhibition form (photocopies acceptable) and must be accompanied by the entry fees. Please ensure that the exhibitor's name, telephone and address are correct.
- e. Entry fees can be paid by cash (CDN \$), debit or credit card, money order, bank draft or acceptable cheque made out to 'Cowichan Exhibition'.
- f. Bring or mail entry forms and fees to the Office: Cowichan Exhibition, 7380 Trans Canada Hwy., Duncan, BC V9L 6B1.
- g. Entries will not be accepted via telephone, fax or e-mail.
- h. The Exhibition reserves the right to limit entries if the number of entries exceeds the space available.
- i. No entry fees will be refunded on cancelled entries.

LIVESTOCK ENTRIES

- Exhibitors may purchase a 3-day Exhibitor Pass for \$17
 when delivering their entry forms. Limit: 1 per exhibitor.
 Single day passes (adults) are available for \$10-\$12/day.
- b. Unless noted otherwise in a Division's rules, entry forms must be received by 5 pm, Saturday, Sept. 2nd, 2022.
- c. All entries must be entered in the name of the owner and must have been that person's bona fide property for at least 30 days prior to the entry deadline.
- d. Proof of ownership and health certificate must be produced on demand. The Exhibition reserves the right to order the removal of any entry that, in its opinion and on the advice of a qualified veterinarian, shows evidence of contagious disease.
- e. The age of cattle is as outlined in the Beef and Dairy Cattle divisions. The age of horses is as of Jan. 1st, 2022.
- f. All barns are to be left clean with the bedding cleaned out. Exhibitors leaving dirty stalls/pens will forfeit their prize money.
- g. Staples, tacks or tape used for display signage must be removed.
- h. No smoking in or around the barns.
- i. Use Livestock Gate #3 (Buckerfield's Gate) for all pickup and delivery.
- j. The Exhibition will supply bedding and water. Exhibitors are responsible for fee/hay for their livestock.

PARKING AND UNLOADING

 Only feed /livestock trucks and other service vehicles will be allowed on the Grounds prior to 10 am daily. b. No vehicle access to the Grounds between 10 am - 4 pm.

c. Parking is available in designated areas outside Gate #3 (Buckerfield's Gate).

LIVESTOCK PRIZE MONEY

- a. Any exhibitor who violates any general or specific Division rule shall forfeit any or all prize money and any awards made to them.
- b. Prize money awarded in all Livestock Divisions will be prorated based upon the number of entries in each class.
- Prize money less than \$10 will not be mailed; please pick it up at the Office. Cheques for all other prize money will be mailed.
- d. If you have not received your prize money cheque by Nov. 1st, 2022, please contact the Office.

JUDGING AND DISPUTES

- a. The Judge's decision(s) will be final.
- b. No person shall be allowed to act as a judge if they are in any way financially interested in the entries.
- c. Chairpersons are not to judge their own Divisions.
- d. Judges are not obligated to award a prize if an entry does not merit it. A SINGLE ENTRY IN A CLASS DOES NOT GUARANTEE A PRIZE.
- e. All Livestock class protests must be made in writing, must state plainly the nature of the complaint, and must be delivered with a deposit of \$25 to the Exhibition Office within 3 hours of the judge's decision.
- f. The deposit will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. The Exhibition's Board of Directors shall be the final judge of all protests.

- d. Cattle must be Brucellosis-free, in good health, free from ringworm, parasites and skin diseases.
- e. All requests for special stabling are at the discretion of the Beef Convenor. Such requests must be submitted in writing with the entry form.
- f. 4-H animals may be shown in the Open Show. Use the Open Livestock Entry Form: entry fees apply.
- g. The Beef Committee is the final authority on all problems not adequately covered by the General Rules & Regulations.
- h. 3-Day Exhibitor's Pass: \$17. The regular gate entry fee for adults is \$10-\$12/day.

- d. There are two ways to register: online at www.cowex. ca (click on FAIR 2022 and follow the links) or in person in the Exhibition Office on any week day (9:30 to 4:00), 7380 Trans Canada Hwy., Duncan, BC V9L 6B1.
- Fill in the appropriate registration form online or in the Office (photocopies acceptable). Please ensure that the exhibitor's name, telephone number and address are correct.
- f. Entry fees to be paid at time of registration by cash (CDN \$), debit or credit card, money order, bank draft or acceptable cheque made out to 'Cowichan Exhibition'.
- Registration will not be accepted via telephone, fax or e-mail.

Minding your Ps & Ss!

DID YOU KNOW? Pumpkins are a type of squash, and both belong to the *cucurbitaceae* (gourd) family. Cucumbers, luffas, watermelons and melons are part of the same family, and all of them grow on vines.

TWO THINGS that set pumpkins apart from squash are their edible seeds and their stems. When you pick up a pumpkin, pay attention to its handle (technically called a *peduncle*); it's more rigid, prickly and angular than the stems of other squashes.



DESIGN – A floral design may include dried, weathered, and/ or treated plant materials, with or without fresh-cut plant materials. Artificial plant materials such as silk flowers are not acceptable. Accessories (e.g. candles, stones, ribbon, and pottery figurines) are allowed.

N.A.S. – Not According to Schedule (on judge's note). NOVICE – Someone who has not won a ribbon in any competitive Flower Show.

POTTED PLANT – A house plant grown indoors, in the house or in a greenhouse. It should be shown in a single plain container. A potted plant may be grown indoors or outdoors. SNIFTER – A large, short-stemmed glass goblet with the bowl narrowing toward the top.

VASE – A container with the inside mouth dimension less than the height of the container.

Standards for Baking:

Yeast breads. Well shaped, tender yet crisp, free from cracks, no large holes inside, no yeasty smell, sweet, nutty flavour.

Quick breads. Even golden brown, level top, light and tender, no strong flavour of salt or baking powder.

Muffins. Rounded tops, moist, tender, no large holes inside, no strong flavour of salt or baking powder.

Pies. Pastry golden brown, flaky and tender, filling should be of a consistency to hold its shape when served.

Cakes. Evenly risen, fine even grain, light and springy, icing should not be too thick, should be creamy and not granular.

Cookies. Uniform size, tender, moist, rolled cookies should be crisp but not tough, even colour top and bottom.

Standards for Preserves:

Canning. Product should be uniform in size and colour, half inch head space, no cloudiness or sediment, metal band should be free from rust and easy to remove. Note: paraffin is no longer recommended as a reliable seal.

Jams and jellies: Quarter-inch head space, natural fruit flavour, not too sweet, nice consistency, not too runny or too thick, no sign of mould, jellies should be clear and sparkling with no fruit, pulp or seeds.



- 1 c. light brown sugar, packed
- 1 c. granulated sugar
- 2 eggs, room temperature
- 2 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1/2 tsp. baking soda

- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1 1/2 c. all-purpose flour
- 2 c. quick oats
- 1 c. unsweetened shredded coconut
- 2 c. Rice Krispies, or other puff rice cereal

INSTRUCTIONS:

Preheat the oven to 350°F.

Line cookie sheets with parchment paper.

Beat the butter until smooth and beat in the granulated and brown sugars until combined well.

Mix in the eggs and vanilla extract.

Combine the all-purpose flour together with the baking powder and baking soda. Stir in the quick oats.

Add the flour mixture together with the wet mixture and stir in the coconut.

Slowly stir in the Rice Krispies or puff rice cereal last.

Scoop by 2 tablespoonful onto parchment paper-lined cookie sheets. Bake for 11 to 13 minutes.

Cool on cookie sheets for 10 minutes before transferring to a rack.



Tips from the Cowichan Valley Camera Club

GENERAL:

- Is the print free of smudges, scratches and finger prints?
- Print quality is important; consider having your image printed commercially.
- Great light makes great pictures. Use soft lighting for people, and early morning or late day lighting for landscapes. Avoid midday sun.
- When photographing pets, compose your image at eye level; it will let their personality shine through.
- When composing pictures involving a horizon, i.e. landscapes or seascapes, ensure the horizon is level (horizontally aligned).
- Before taking a picture, check the areas around and behind your subject. A cluttered background is distracting and takes away from your subject.

VIEWPOINT:

- Does the image fit the theme of the class?
- Does the image grab your attention? Is it a fresh, original view of the subject?
- Does the image avoid being too busy and confusing?

COMPOSITION:

- Is the cropping effective and complimentary to your subject (i.e. horizontal, vertical, panoramic)?
- Fill the frame with your subject.
- *Is the viewer's attention led to the main subject?*
- Is the subject offset using the 'rule of thirds'?

TECHNIQUE:

- Avoid overexposing the lighter details and underexposing the dark shadows.
- Is the image in focus where it should be?
- Has good use been made of contrasting and complementary colours?






