## **Section 2: Comb Honey**

## CLASS #

- 6. Section (e.g. Ross Round, Half Hogg Cassette, square section) 3 sections of cut comb, all 3 must exceed 300g. Ross rounds and square section entries must be displayed in the original circular or square section. Sections must be in containers made for the display of that respective style. One container may be opened to facilitate the Judge's evaluation of the entry. There should be no leaking of honey from the comb into the box.
- 7. Full Frame Shallow Dadant or deep Langstroth (no black foundation). *Must be submitted on a frame stand (the stand need not be elaborate, it will not be judged).*

## Section 3: Beeswax and Pollen

#### CLASS#

- 8. Beeswax Block two identical 500-gram blocks of wax, submit on a plain white paper towel or plate, or in a zip-top bag. The wax should be clean and free of impurities. The block should be smooth-surfaced and free of blemishes, decorations or embellishments. Preferable colour should be lemon yellow with a pleasant fragrance.
- 9. Pollen three 375ml jars

# Section 4: Mead (Honey Wine)

10. Mead, any type – Two 750ml glass bottles (clear, uncoloured, standard wine bottle) filled to a point precisely 2cm from the bottom of the cork. Entry to be accompanied by a description of the type of mead and full recipe (including all ingredients). Mead to be made from honey produced by the exhibitor.

# Section 6: Miscellaneous (open to all ages)

#### CLASS #

- 12. Hive-derived creation Potions, lotions, lip balm, candles, toothpastes, infused honey. Entry to consist of two identical items (1 for sampling and 1 for display). The product's recipe must include the exhibitor's honey, beeswax, and/or propolis. Entry to be presented in a re-sealable, unembellished container appropriate to the product, and should weigh between 1 8 oz.
- 13. Gadget Entry must be directly apiculture-related and must be the original creation of the exhibitor.
- 14. Art Graphics, pottery, needlework, poetry and other projects directly apiculture-related. Entry must be the original creation of the exhibitor.
- 15. Photography Pollinators, Beekeepers, and Photography from the Hive, min. size 5" x 7" [12.7cm x 17.7cm]. The Cowichan Beekeepers (Non-profit society) will have the right to use submitted photos for its website and its non-profit society publications. A picture of the image will be taken for potential use by the Cowichan Beekeepers (the exhibitor will be credited as the photographer), and the entry will be returned at the end of the Exhibition.
- 16. Educational Display Its focus will be to teach the public some aspect important to beekeeping. If entry is made of multiple parts, all must be securely attached to a base so entry can be moved if necessary as a single unit. Maximum entry space not to exceed 20" x 20" [50cm x 50cm]. Any quotes or non-original material must be referenced. State age of competitor on entry tag.
- **17. NEW!** Theme Gift Basket Fill a basket with hive products (at least one created by the exhibitor) and bee-friendly items (such as seeds for plants pollinators love). *Use the Exhibition's 2023 theme "The Very Hungry Caterpillar" and colours: Raspberry Red, Leafy Green & Purple Plum, as inspiration for the basket's presentation.*
