Section 2: Spinning

Include a sample of the unspun fibre(s). Identify each fibre, source, and preparation for spinning. Skeins to be at least 25 yd [23m].

- 5. Handspun skein Novice (spinning less than 2 years)
- 6. Handspun skein wheel spun
- 7. Handspun skein spindle spun
- 8. Handspun skein Designer Yarn. An unusual yarn with a strand of a commercial yarn or thread as part of its structure.
- 9. Spin for a purpose: Wearables. One skein plus a fabric swatch [4" x 4"; 10cm x 10cm] of the planned project i.e. sweater, socks, shawl, etc.
- 10. Spin for a purpose: For the Home. One skein plus a fabric swatch [4" x 4"; 10cm x 10cm] of the planned project i.e. table runner, rug, hanging, etc.
- 11. Accessory: For head, hands, or feet i.e. hat, gloves, mitts, slippers or socks from handspun yarn.
- 12. "It's a Wrap" scarf, cowl, shawl or stole from handspun yarn(s)
- 13. Any other item made from handspun yarn

Section 3: Weaving

With each entry, include the following information on a card:

- i. identify thread(s), include a sample of each
- ii. technique (i.e. 4-shaft waffle weave)
- iii. type of loom (i.e. rigid heddle)

- 14. Any project by a Novice (weaving less than 2 years)
- 15. Garment
- 16. Scarf, shawl or stole woven with commercial yarn
